Since 1947, The Guardsmen has been working tirelessly to help Bay Area at-risk youth. These children from

low-income households, including foster children, are less likely to develop the core skills necessary to develop into successful adults. Thankfully, with your support, The Guardsmen provides these at-risk youth, with greater opportunities for a brighter, enriching, and successful future, which they otherwise would not be afforded.

As you will see in the pages below, The Guardsmen's Scholarship and Campership programs continue to change the course of thousands of Bay Area youth's lives. We awarded 284 scholarships and supported 13,750 days of camp last year for these children. Our ability to fund these programs is dependent on

the generosity of our donors and sponsors, as well as the efforts of our members who spend roughly 12,000 volunteer hours a year planning and carrying out our philanthropic events.

Generations of The Guardsmen's members and supporters like you have enabled us to improve these kids' lives through our unique approach of Fun, Fellowship and Fundraising. However, there is still much work to do. This year the need for assistance outweighed our ability to support all qualified applicants, so unfortunately, we had to turn away deserving kids from our Scholarship and Campership programs. We hope you will continue to support The Guardsmen going forward, so together we can make a positive, lasting impact on the lives of more kids every year.

Two years ago, our Senior Members

launched a Capital Campaign to grow our Endowment Funds in perpetuity, with a specific focus on the Senior Scholarship Endowment Fund; they have already raised over 3 million dollars to help support at-risk youth in the years to come. ABOUT THE GUARDSMEN

MISSION

The Guardsmen makes a life-changing difference in the lives of at-risk youth by raising funds for scholarship, campership and other youth programs. We mobilize the talents, energy and resources of our members, friends, families, and professional colleagues, and in doing so, strengthen our entire community.

OUR BEGINNING

In 1947 a group of young San Francisco professionals, who were to become known as The Guardsmen, joined together to help disadvantaged children in the Bay Area. These young men recognized that they were among the most fortunate members of society, who had good careers, loving families, and many opportunities – past, present, and future. They decided they had a responsibility to “give back” in the interest of individual children, and society at large. They were concerned that although at-risk youth were provided basic necessities and help by existing civic and community agencies, many children had no opportunity to experience life outside the confines of an often harsh inner-city environment.

Beyond this desire to give back, these founding members of The Guardsmen also enjoyed the camaraderie that came from working together. The Guardsmen recognized that they could combine fun, fellowship

and fundraising. To this end, The Guardsmen began hosting fundraising events – dinners, raffles, a Christmas Tree Lot – in order to raise money for local children’s charities and programs. Membership of The Guardsmen was established entirely through word-of-mouth, and the organization quickly became a network of talented young individuals committed to building stronger communities. Over time, national, state, and civic leaders began to formally recognize The Guardsmen’s efforts and its vision for impacting youth through enhanced opportunities.

The Guardsmen’s first efforts revolved around the importance of athletics and outdoor activities. The Crystal Plunge Swimming Team was one of the first recipients of support when The Guardsmen helped them travel to Chicago to compete in the AAU championships. Several of the team’s members went on to win gold medals at the 1948 Olympics.

Early Guardsmen members recognized that children at-risk benefited from a mentor relationship, particularly if it was cultivated in a setting conducive to developing friendships (ex: “the great outdoors”). Thus, The Guardsmen began a program that thrives today in order to send at-risk children and youth to summer camp: The Guardsmen Campership Program.

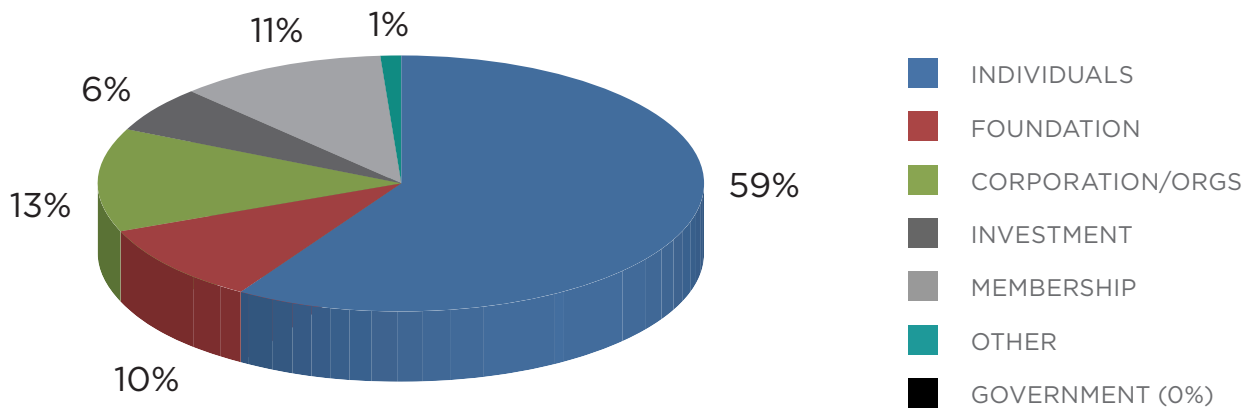
During a strategic review on the 50th anniversary of the organization in 1998, The Guardsmen identified a need for improved educational choices for at-risk youth, many of whom were lost in an unresponsive and dysfunctional education system that only reinforced cycles of poverty and violence. To address this need, The Guardsmen Scholarship Program was created in order to provide partial private school scholarships for at-risk children and youth.



THE GUARDSMEN 2017-2018 FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

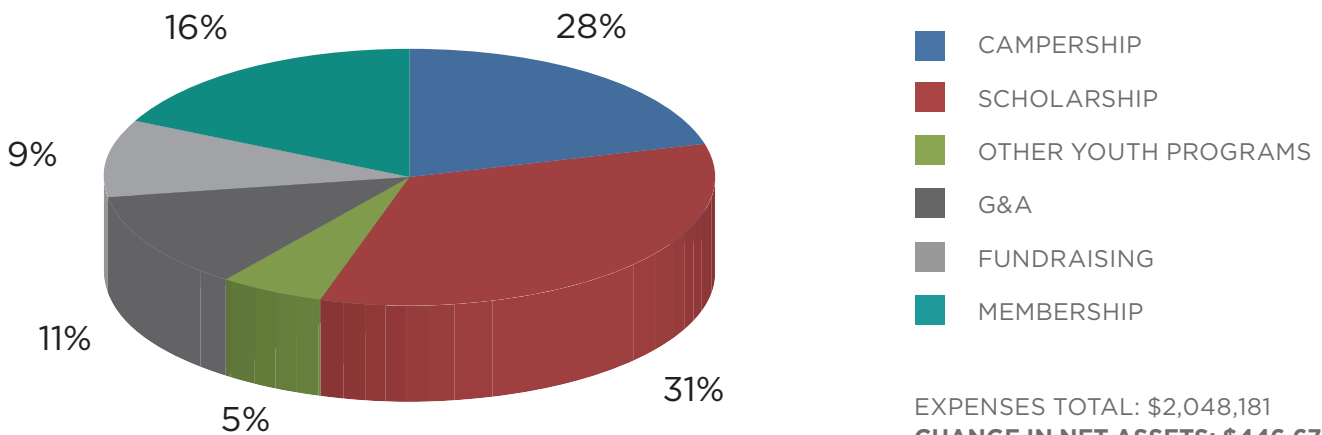
FY ENDING 9/30/18

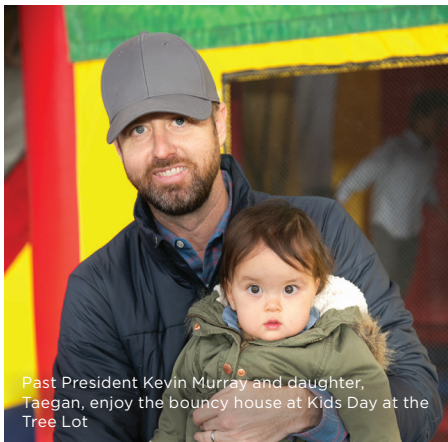

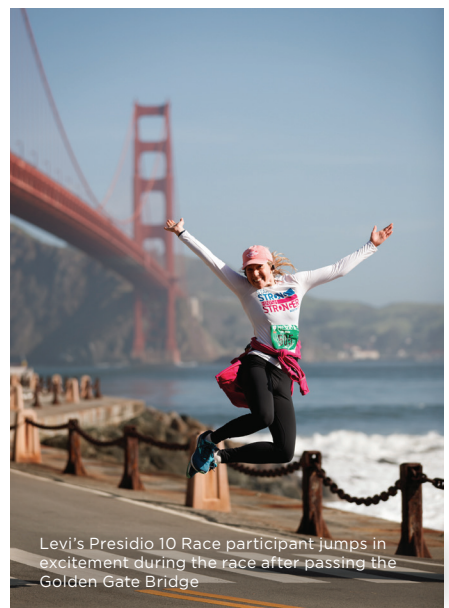

CAMPERSHIP PROGRAM

The Guardsmen Campership Program sends at-risk children and youth to summer camp in order to close the opportunity gap through environmental education and stewardship, leadership training, and influential mentors. Campers must be ages 6-17, reside in the Bay Area, and meet the *Alaska Reduced School Lunch Program financial guidelines in order to be eligible for a Guardsmen Campership.

INTRODUCING CAMP PHOENIX



Alumni camper Daniel “Zeus” says, *“Over the 3 years I was a camper, instead of laying around the house playing video games and wasting my time, I was learning and more importantly, not losing anything I had learned over the previous year. Transformation is growing as an individual. Because of Camp Phoenix, I was able to do just that. If it weren’t for the group readings, science experiments, and countless night swims, I wouldn’t be the very person you see here today.”*

Zeus is one of the first members of the recently launched High School Counselor-in-Training (CIT) program, where alumni campers return to develop their workplace and leadership skills.

The Guardsmen has been a critical partner in propelling Camp Phoenix’s work forward since 2015, helping to grow the camp from 40 youth to over 120 kids yearly. With over 70% of youth returning each summer, we are confident that Camp Phoenix has a long-lasting impact on camper’s lives, and **we are proud to have supported 14 campers and 265 days of camp during the summer of 2018 at Camp Phoenix.**

Camp Phoenix is summer school; reimaged. What if summer school looked like reading in the redwoods, measuring banana slugs, and calculating your rate for berry picking? Camp Phoenix makes all of this happen for the Bay Area’s most under-resourced middle-schoolers. Its mission is to close the opportunity gap for low-income youth through outdoor learning experiences in the summer, and all year long. Camp Phoenix provides a 3-week, overnight academic summer program to 100% low-income youth, as well as 50 additional hours of weekend nature excursions all year long. The program empowers youth

to make 2 months of growth in math and reading each summer, instead of falling victim to “summer learning loss” that research shows plays a significant role in the achievement gap between middle and low-income students.

At Camp Phoenix, it’s a tradition for everyone to choose a camp name, like “Sunshine” or “Thunder Cat”, for their three weeks together. This silly tradition is a fun way for kids to express themselves at camp, while symbolizing a greater theme of identity exploration in the middle-school years.

MEET MELANIE "ROSE", CAMP PHOENIX

Coming back from camp, I do not feel like a different person. My personality hasn't changed, and I have not changed who I am. I instead just feel like an improved, enhanced, happier, and more enthusiastic version of myself. In camp I've made so many friends to last me a lifetime and gone through so many experiences I can't even try to describe how amazing my experience at camp was, as words in themselves can't do justice to it. Although I'm physically leaving this camp after 3 weeks of it, I will keep living some of it mentally, and will keep all of it emotionally, somewhere in my heart. There was one moment, I remember, when we were throwing hatchets. I remember this very vividly, a hatchet in my hand, getting ready to throw it into a block of wood. I swung my arm back, getting ready for the throw, and watched in excitement and awe, as it hooked onto the wood and, this time, stayed there. That was my 5th try. I felt so powerful, so capable. That feeling of success, of accomplishment, is the best way I can describe my overall experience at camp. I think all kids should be

able to go through this, as not only does camp involve everything I just mentioned, but it also teaches you a lot academically. You can have a lot of fun while still being educated and ready for school in the coming year. I really hope more kids can experience Camp Phoenix -we all deserve experiences like this.

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

In commemoration of The Guardsmen's 50th Anniversary, The Scholarship Program was created in order to address the child education achievement gap in the Bay Area. Eligible students must reside in the Bay Area, enter one of grades K-9, maintain a minimum GPA of 2.7 and meet the *Alaska Reduced School Lunch Program financial guidelines in order to be enrolled in the Scholarship Program. The Guardsmen commits to each recipient throughout high school as long as the student remains eligible and re-applies each year. Siblings are also given priority in order to ensure the deepest impact possible within a family.

INTRODUCING ARCHBISHOP RIORDAN HIGH SCHOOL

Archbishop Riordan High School is San Francisco's oldest all-boys high school, serving 700 students from diverse backgrounds.

Riordan strives to create the best possible educational experience for young men. To do that, they provide top-quality academics, inspired educators, and opportunities for students to find their passions and build meaningful relationships with their peers, teachers and coaches. It is

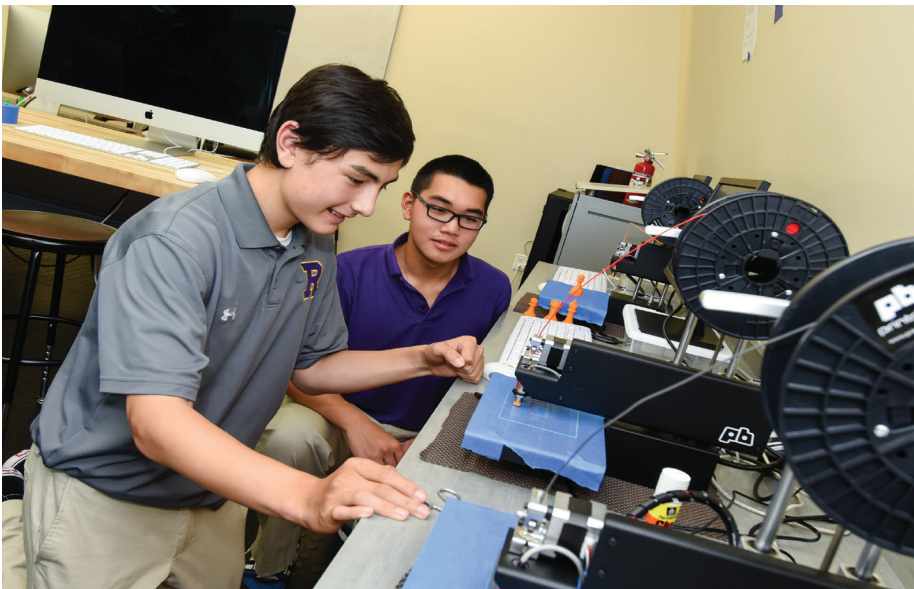
important that students read great books, become expert problem-solvers and learn technical skills, but also develop a desire to care for their families, the community and the world. Riordan students achieve this through a faith-based learning environment, in the Catholic Marianist tradition, that includes opportunities for retreats and spiritual growth.

In the past few years Riordan has made many campus improvements

to support its educational mission, including upgrading classrooms, renovating the gym, and developing engineering and automotive programs, all with a focus on the needs and interests of young men. In summer 2019 they will break ground on a state-of-the-art turf field that will benefit not only the students and their athletic and recreational pursuits, but the greater community as well.

Riordan "is deeply grateful to partner organizations such as The Guardsmen that support [its] mission." More than 60 percent of Riordan's students receive some sort of financial assistance, and more than half will be the first in their family to graduate from college. Educating a Riordan student truly impacts the entire community, both now and in the future.

The Guardsmen is proud to have supported 12 students with a scholarship of \$2,000 each during the 2017-2018 school year.

MEET JERUEL “JJ” TRUJEQUE, RIORDAN



Without The Guardsmen Scholarship Program, sophomore Jeruel “JJ” Trujeque would not have been able to attend Riordan, which was his first-choice school. He is happy and thriving at San Francisco’s oldest all-boys Catholic high school, where he has had the opportunity to try anything from football to writing, and everything in between. So far, he is firing on all cylinders. JJ is taking a full load of courses including Spanish II, Biology, Modern World History, Geometry, Scripture, World Literature, Journalism, and Leadership. He was elected to Riordan’s Student Parliament (the school’s governing body) where he is an advocate for fellow students and helps to plan many important school events such as dances, service drives, and rallies. Additionally, he is a defensive back on the football team.

A budding writer, JJ’s passion for all things literary has blossomed during his time at Riordan. He writes for the student newspaper, *The Crusader*, and recently published his first article “Sunnyside District hides dark past” about an area jail that closed in the 1930s. Literature is his favorite subject because he enjoys reading and learning about different classic novels. JJ applied for a prestigious three-week summer workshop at Bard College in Massachusetts called Young Writers Workshop. If accepted, he hopes this program will inspire new creative avenues and help him further refine his craft. Reflecting on his time a student at Riordan, JJ says, “Riordan really gave me a chance, which opened up so many great opportunities that I wouldn’t have had otherwise.”

PARTNER SCHOOLS

In recent evaluations of our Scholarship Program, committee members came to realize that while many schools were being served, the quality of their education to our recipients was not being monitored or measured through the application process. In order to maximize The Guardsmen Scholarship, committee members decided, and the Board of Directors agreed, that setting greater expectations for our partner schools would give our Scholarship recipients a far better chance at breaking the cycles of poverty, furthering their education, and setting themselves up for success. During the 2017-2018 school year, The Guardsmen partnered with 23 schools and will continue to annually choose to partner with schools that are in line with our mission, produce high performance and graduation rates, and provide positive environments for their students to learn and thrive.
